Drawing anime characters was one of my first real steps into the art world. Partly because I've always loved watching anime and its many distinct, memorable characters... and partly because it's an excellent gateway into understanding human anatomy.

What makes anime such a strong starting point for me is the balance it offers. You get to explore the fundamentals of drawing the human figure without the pressure of making everything look perfectly realistic. It allows you to study structure, proportions, and expression, all while still embracing stylization and creative freedom.

That's why I decided to create a series of lessons focused on drawing anime characters. The course is structured in clear, progressive steps for each topic, so you can build your skills systematically rather than feeling overwhelmed.

Whenever it makes sense, you'll also get dedicated worksheets with focused exercises to reinforce what you've learned and give you structured practice. New lessons are released weekly for Patreon supporters and YouTube members, continuously expanding the course step by step.

Each lesson is available both as an online post and as a downloadable, printable PDF ... so you can study in the format that works best for you.

Just to clarify: when I say "anime" from here on, I'm referring to both anime and manga. Technically, anime is the animated, more colorful, version of manga. However, to keep the text simple and easy to read, I'll just use the term "anime" from here on.
